

## Notice to All Companies operating in High-Risk Construction Activity

IF FIRE RATING IS	THESE REGULATIONS APPLY
HIGH	<p>After <b>three consecutive days of a “high”</b> rating, <u>high-risk construction activity</u> in the interface area (within 10 metres of the forest) shall cease at 1300 hours each day and a minimum two hour fire watch is required after construction ceases.</p> <p>Please refer to the “Interface Construction and Maintenance Regulations” for examples of high-risk construction activity.</p> <p>Construction activity may resume to a regular schedule only after the fire danger falls to “Moderate” or “Low”.</p>
EXTREME	<p>In addition to those items stated in “high” fire danger class, the following shall apply:</p> <p>After <b>three consecutive days of an “extreme”</b> rating, all <u>high-risk construction activity</u> in the interface area (within 10 metres of the forest) shall cease.</p> <p>As explained in the regulations, all other work shall maintain a minimum two-hour fire watch after construction ceases. Please refer to the “Interface Construction and Maintenance Regulations” for examples of construction and other work activities that may continue during an “extreme” fire danger class.</p> <p>High-risk construction activity may resume to the 13:00 hour schedule when the fire danger falls to “High”.</p> <p>All construction restrictions shall be lifted when the danger rating is at “Moderate” or “Low”.</p>
EXEMPTIONS	<p>Exemptions to the above stated construction restrictions may be granted based on a site specific inspection and prescription for mitigating measures.</p> <p>Please refer to the “Interface Construction and Maintenance Regulations” for further information.</p>

Please note that the forecast data is highlighted in blue, and the actual data is usually posted mid-afternoon. The actual data may or may not confirm the forecasted data.
