

IDENTIFICATION REQUIRED TO VOTE

Resident Voter

You must provide two separate pieces of identification that prove who you are and where you live – or make a solemn declaration about where you live.

Non-resident Voter

You must provide two separate pieces of identification that prove who you are and where you live as well as the address or legal description and the title (or other proof of ownership) of the property you own. Only one owner can vote – and they must have the written consent of the majority of the other owners (see Form 2-8) – when you own a property with one or more people.

Acceptable Types of Identification

- BC Drivers Licence
- BC Identification Card
- BC CareCard
- BC Services Card (considered one piece of ID)
- ICBC Certificate of Insurance
- Canadian Social Insurance Number
- Canadian Citizenship Card
- Real Property Tax Notice
- Credit Card/Debit Card (with name on it)
- Valid Canadian Passport
- Utility Bill

One piece of identification must include your signature.
