



Sister City Exchange Program Strategies

- The goal of the Sister City Exchange Program is to provide an amazing cross cultural program that explores the traditions, history, language and present day geography of both countries. It is to help form a closer bond between the Canadian and Japanese communities as both have such amazing and diverse backgrounds each can learn from. The continuation of the program requires success of those participating in this program.
- Successful exchanges require keen motivation and a sustained commitment by participating students and families. While there will certainly be moments of excitement and joy, there may also be moments of confusion and frustration. Applicants should be prepared to commit to the exchange, regardless of the difficulties encountered.
- Once selected, a strict and formal contract must be signed and followed. Not abiding to the contract will result in termination & future applications by the family will not be permitted.
- At all times, participants are to act in an ambassador-style manner.
- The (50%) purchased fee for the flight will be due prior to April 30, 2019. Remaining fees are due one month prior to our departure to Karuizawa, Japan.
- Only suitable photographs & photographs approved by program participants shall be posted in social media.
- All exchange students are to be provided with either their own private room or a shared room with the other exchange student. Exchange students must be provided with their own bed.
- In almost all situations, Whistler youth are paired in a home in Karuizawa. If there are an uneven number of students, the students may be placed in groups of 3.
- A phone number and home address for all students, their families, and the chaperones emergency contact information (for both visiting and hosting chaperones) shall be provided to visiting students prior to their arrival for the following reasons.
- Police Information Checks – all parents participating in the home stay program are required to complete & submit PIC to the RMOW.
- Parents – drinking alcohol in your home while hosting youth from a foreign county must be kept to an absolute minimum, wherein impairment and judgment is in good standing at all times.

- Any form, inappropriate behavior by a home stay family member will be dealt with quickly, efficiently, and discreetly for the benefit of the students. Depending on the severity of the situation, police may be called to assist in the matter.

- Parents and students participating in the student exchange program will receive information most often through e-mail. It is therefore important that both parents and students check their e-mail at least once a week.

- Students participating in the exchange program are required to create a Presentation upon return from Karuizawa, Japan.

- Use of drugs or other illegal substances by the exchange student during the program in Whistler or in Karuizawa will result in the immediate termination of the student's exchange.

- If anyone within the family participating in the exchange program are involved in any form of abnormal behavior or conduct that does not reflect the programs strategies, that family may no longer be able to participate in any subsequent or further exchange programs with Whistler or Karuizawa.
