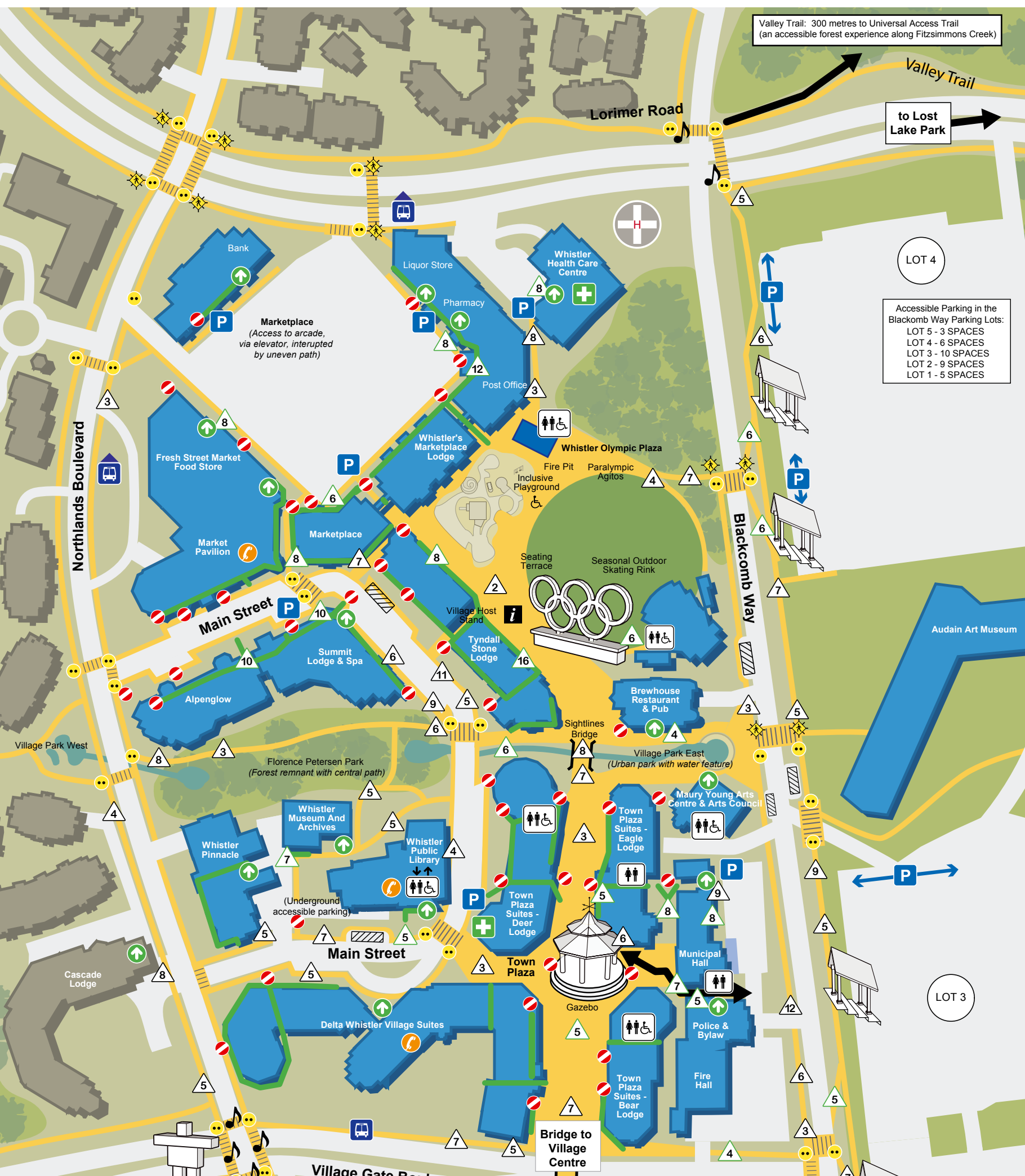

NOTES:

1. The Village features a car free main path known as the Stroll, as well as covered arcade routes adjacent to and through several buildings. The arcades and building entries are often raised above the Stroll as part of a flood protection plan. All arcades have ramp access from the Stroll, though some parts of buildings unfortunately remain inaccessible.
2. The day parking lots and Village areas are separated by a flood protection berm. Stairs and ramps connect the Village to the lots.
3. From Lorimer Road and Blackcomb Way in Village North, the paved Valley Trail heads east to Lost Lake Park. Along the way, at Fitzsimmons Creek, an accessible trail offers an appealing forest and wetland experience. The trail is level, wide, well-compacted, and has good sightlines and less than 5% slopes. Like most trails in Whistler, it is shared with pedestrians, cyclists and wildlife.

Note: Principal building entries are shown; other entries, including entries to shops and cafes, are not shown. Slope numbers should be considered accurate plus or minus 1-2%.

Upper Village is northeast of Village Centre. The two areas are shown side-by-side. The relative positions of the two areas would be shown if you lined up the two FITZ notations.

- This map of the Village Centre shows a dense cluster of buildings and streets. Key features include:
 - **Streets:** Village Gate Boulevard, Whistler Way, Valley Trail, Village Lane, Mountain Lane, Springs Lane, and Blackcomb Way.
 - **Buildings:** Whistler Conference Centre, Rainbow Theatre, Whistler Village Inn, Sundial Hotel, Mountain Lodge, and various shops like the Grocery Store and Liquor Store.
 - **Accessibility:** Numerous icons for ramps, stairs, accessible entrances, and parking stalls are scattered throughout.
 - **Transit:** A bus loop and taxi loop are indicated near the center.
 - **Annotations:** A box notes that Village 8 Cinemas is located downstairs in the Village Common. Another box lists accessible parking spaces in the Blackcomb Way Parking Lots: LOT 5 - 3 SPACES, LOT 4 - 6 SPACES, LOT 3 - 10 SPACES, LOT 2 - 9 SPACES, and LOT 1 - 5 SPACES.
 - **Orientation:** Arrows point towards Village North, Upper Village, and the Gondola Transit Loop.

 - **Streets:** Valley Trail, Blackcomb Way, Lorimer Road, and Bridge Meadows Trail.
 - **Buildings:** Fairmont Chateau Whistler, Club Intrawest, and the Squamish Lil'wat Cultural Centre.
 - **Accessibility:** Icons for ramps, stairs, and accessible entrances are present.
 - **Transit:** A bus stop is shown near the center.
