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## WHISTLER TEMPORARY ACCESSIBLE PARKING PERMIT PROGRAM FOR PEOPLE WITH DISABILITIES

## **REPLACEMENT/VISITOR PERMIT HOLDER INFORMATION**

### Your Permit

Based on the information on your application and signature stating that you have mobility impairment or a non-visible disability that affects your ability to walk 100 meters; you have been issued a Whistler Replacement or Visitor Accessible Parking Permit.

**Replacement or Visitor Permit** - this permit has an expiry date within 12 months. To have it renewed you must submit another application.

#### Your Responsibilities

#### You are responsible for insuring that this permit is used in an appropriate manner.

When to use your permit: The permit can be used only when <u>you</u>, the registered permit holder, are leaving a parked vehicle; <u>it must not be used by anyone else</u> - even if he/she has mobility impairment. <u>Misuse of this permit</u> will result in the loss of associate privileges and no further permits will be issued to you.

Where you use your permit: When you park in a designated parking space, the permit must hang from you rear-view mirror or placed up on top of the dashboard. The registration number, expiry date and wheelchair symbol must face out of the vehicle. The Permit must be removed from the mirror when the vehicle is in motion because it will obscure the driver's vision.

**Extend courtesy to others:** Permit holders need the designated parking spaces for different reasons - wheelchairs users need extra width for transferring in and out of their vehicles while other need proximity to an entrance because walking is difficult.
